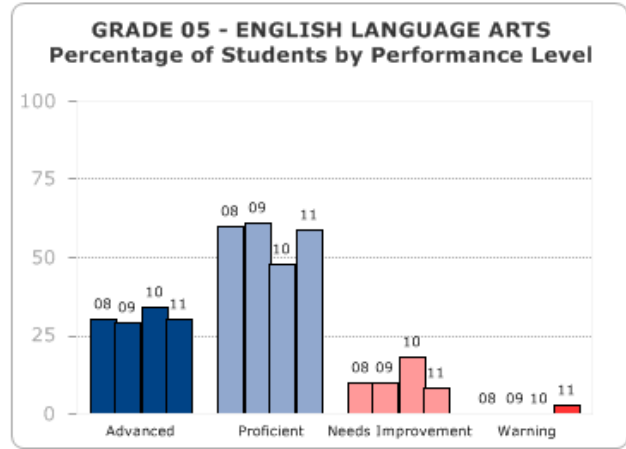
Percent of Students at Each Performance Level for Helen Keller Elementary
