What, where, and how to recycle in Franklin, MA

The following table is a guide to what items can be recycled in Franklin. Note that not all items can be recycled in your curbside recycling cart. Some types of items are accepted only at the Beaver Street Recycling Center recycling center, and other items can be recycled at stores and other specialty locations.
